Minnesota Beef Expo Welcomed Cattle Producers and Youth Livestock Exhibitors to St. Paul

Oct. 30, 2024

St. Paul, Minn. – The Minnesota Beef Expo welcomed more than 1,100 cattle and 700 youth livestock exhibitors to the Minnesota State Fairgrounds on Oct. 17-20, 2024. This four-day event, celebrating and promoting the beef industry, is the largest all-breed beef show in Minnesota. The 2024 Expo included youth contests, cattle sales, a trade show, educational seminars and a junior show where 1,136 head of cattle were exhibited.

The Expo kicked off Thursday, Oct. 17, with a youth knowledge bowl testing participants' beef industry understanding. In the senior division, Lydia Rose, Lane Olson, Marshall Heldberg and Kelly Willegal took home first. Champions in the intermediate division A were Landin Rose, Grant Dose, Charlie Klehr and Eli Doeling, and in division B were Hailey Thoele, Anna Mages, Nora Doehling and Jaquiline Heldberg. Caleb Klehr, Carson Wendinger, Kathryn Rose and Aubrey Wendinger received first place in the junior division.

Thursday also brought the Sullivan Supply Stock Show University Fitting Seminar where experts taught youth how to clip and prepare their cattle for the show ring. Following the seminar, a record 30 teams competed for champion fitting honors in the annual Sullivan Supply fitting contest. The champion team consisted of Tom Coonrod, Roman Schwab, Charlie Friemann and Matthew Friemann.

On Thursday evening, youth exhibitors and cattle producers gathered for the Minnesota Youth Beef Experience Program's (MYBEP) Ideas & Insights Symposium where attendees learned from industry professionals and a celebrity keynote speaker. This year's keynote speaker was cattle rancher, advocate and author Amanda Radke. Her speech, "The 'Ps' Every Motivated Young Person Needs to Know," empowered participants to chase their dreams while giving them the tools to effectively utilize social media to advocate for agriculture, brand themselves and carve out opportunities in the field of their choice.

Friday's schedule offered a judging contest where participants competed in four age categories for top prizes. In the junior division, Payton Foster was the top individual, and Lil Randoms, which included Payton Foster, Ryan Harguth, Tilly Chandler and Ellie Adams, was the champion team. In the intermediate division, the champion individual was Kate Schmidt. The top team was Goodhue; team members included Avery Stark, Jakob Jenson, Haley Betcher and Blake Stark. Tyler Kurt took home top individual honors in the senior division. The champion senior team was Lydia Rose, Josie Lorentz, Jaxon Hilbrands and Brennir Peterson of the Top Gunners. And finally, Sadie Sullivan was the individual champion in the adult division.

Friday's youth activities ended with junior showmanship contest judged by Zac Hall of Minnesota and Carmen Paulsen of Iowa. Channing Lind, Payton Foster, Cora Stade, Nolan Hackett, Ava Schoenfeld and Leighton Hackett were champions in their respective divisions.

The Supreme Row Show and Sale was held Saturday, Oct. 19. Supreme Row Champions took home \$6,750 in prize money thanks to sponsors Lee Agri-Media, Show-Rite & Hubbard Feeds, Purina Animal Nutrition, Rabo AgriFinance, Lanesboro Sale Commission and Optimizer Calf Gel.

The Supreme Row Champion Female was WP Barbara 410, consigned by Windy Pine Cattle of Woodville, Wis., and bought by Brooks Dodd of Decorah, Iowa. The Reserve Supreme Champion Female was Schmitz Momma Mia 4753M (also the highest-selling animal at \$11,000), consigned by Lynsey Schmitz of Oakes, N.D., and bought by Kelan Hintz of New Salem, N.D. The Supreme Champion Steer was Whitey, consigned by Lorentz Show Cattle of Woodville, Wis., and bought by Ryden Cleveringa of Alton, Iowa. The Reserve Supreme Champion Steer was Schmitz All In PSAM3M, consigned by Lynsey Schmitz of Oakes, N.D., and bought by Ryden, Iowa.

After an intensive application process, participants in the Minnesota Youth Beef Experience Program (MYBEP) were awarded heifers on Saturday afternoon. Each winner is responsible for raising, breeding and maintaining complete records on care of the animal, while providing monthly progress reports to the original owner and the Minnesota Beef Expo. The breeders who donated heifers will also serve as mentors to the respective winners.

Scott Swanek of Dexter, Minn., exhibited the Supreme Champion Market Beef, and Katie Johnson of Independence, Iowa, showed the Reserve Supreme Champion Market Beef.

Due to construction of the Lee & Rose Warner Coliseum, there will not be an Expo in 2025. The Minnesota Beef Expo will return to the Minnesota State Fairgrounds in October 2026.
